On various tables around the church, you'll find stacks of cards. Pick one up and stick it in your pocket. And, as the book of Proverbs says of God's Words above, you'll find it "pleasant to keep them within you, if all of them are ready on your lips."

There's only one verse printed on the card per month, but if you're feeling ambitious, there are enough Bible references on the card to take you through the entire month, one verse per week.
