Isaiah 55:1-3a, 6-7

At God's command and invitation, we enter his presence and respond with worship.

Call to Worship

Reading of the Word

Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you, I give men in return for you, peoples in exchange for your life. Fear not, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you. I will say to the north, Give up, and to the south, Do not withhold; bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the end of the earth, everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made." Confession of Sin
